What is the Early Years Level?

- The Early Years Level begins in Preschool and continues throughout Primary 1.
- We follow Curriculum for Excellence guidelines which explains how and what your child will be learning. It is very flexible and so it can be adapted to the children's needs and interests.
- We promote active learning to encourage children to engage with their learning through a range of practical and fun activities. Some of which are adult led, some guided by adults and some are childinitiated.

Starting School

- When children arrive at school in August they will begin the academic year with a full school day.
- Children are encouraged to be independent. We expect all our children to follow class/school rules and their own class charter to ensure every child has the best chance to learn and be happy in school.
