
Never Such Innocence – Visit to Schools on 29th, 30th November and 1st December

Never Such Innocence is an educational charity which operates to give children from all over the world a voice on conflict. Our mission is to provide tools for children and young people to reflect upon the realities of war



When you work with young children, you are their inspiration. Let us inspire you.

The Ministry of Defence has resources for forces families and educators to help older children process the emotional challenges of deployment, but there was a lack of resources for early years. Talking about your feelings can be useful, but what if you don't have the words to describe how you're feeling?

This taster training shares learning from our recent research project Wee People, Big Feelings. Tuning into ways wee ones express themselves and learn about the world – using bodies and faces, movement and music and stories. We listen to what they tell us, both verbally and non-verbally. By taking a child-centred approach, we can be responsive to the needs and interests of wee ones in our settings and using creative experiences to help wee ones with the emotional cycle of deployment.

Learning Outcomes:

- Knowledge of arts provocations as opportunities for young children developing emotional literacy and resilience
- The importance of exploring emotional literacy every day emotional literacy isn't developed in moments of crisis
- Links between emotional literacy and non-verbal communication practising FEELING your feelings

The Creative Skills Approach

Starcatchers Creative Skills approach shares open ended expressive arts provocations designed to give babies and young children a voice. For young children to develop a sense of agency and fulfil their rights, they need responsive adults who tune in to their interests with a playful and creative approach. You are their inspiration, and we want to develop your skills and confidence to inspire new thoughts and ideas that will help develop the emotional literacy and improve outcomes for the children you work with.

Starcatchers training is about more than just the sharing of ideas – it's about investing in the Early Years Workforce as individuals and recognising that creative responsive adults are the most valuable "open-ended resource" our children need.

"Every forces family is different, and every deployment is different: sometimes we cope well with the transitions, and sometimes it can bring a lot of challenges. There's no one size fits all approach, it's important we develop a repertoire of techniques to support wee ones and their families."
