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There are lots of ways that you can get involved:-

Celebrate – Encourage children to display banners, purple/dandelion themed artwork around the school and also to enter my MotMC Competition (closing date 26th April)

Identify – Ask parents/carers to let you know if they are serving or have served in the Armed Forces.

Listen – Hold an assembly to learn about Armed Forces students' experiences and the support they feel would help them to thrive in education.

Connect – Connect with HMNB Clyde who may be able to offer outreach activities and highlight support that is available to Armed Forces families.

Inform – Share information in your school newsletter, noticeboards or website to raise awareness of the support you offer to children from an Armed Forces background.

Purple Up – 'Purple Up' day is Friday 26th April - wear purple to celebrate children from Armed Forces families. Purple was chosen as it combines the various colours associated with different branches of the military.

Armed Forces Covenant Fund Trust

Applications for the Armed Forces Covenant Fund Trust: Service Pupil Support Programme is now open and I plan on submitting a cluster bid for the schools across Helensburgh & Lomond. We can apply for between £5,000 and £80,000 for stand-alone projects lasting up to two years.

This year they are encouraging clusters of 3 or more schools to apply for projects supporting Service children under one of three themes:-

- Closing the gap in attainment between Service and non-Service pupils.
- Addressing the needs of Service pupils with additional needs.
- Identifying and addressing the needs of small cohorts of Service pupils within educational settings.

If you have any suggestions or ideas as to what we could apply for as a cluster then please let me know by Friday 19th April 2024. The deadline for this grant is 8th May 2024.
