Overview for Our School Community

Our Vision

At Rosneath Primary School and ELC, we are committed to ensuring every child is supported, included and encouraged to achieve their full potential. Our work is guided by the national vision "Our Children, Their Future - Thriving Together."

Our Three Main Improvement Priorities (2025-2026)

1. Improve Learning, Teaching and Assessment

We want all children to experience high-quality learning every day. This means:

- Teachers using a range of teaching approaches to support, challenge and inspire pupils.
- Clear feedback to help pupils understand their strengths and next steps.
- Staff working together to plan learning and reflect on best practice.

What this means for children:

- More engaging and motivating lessons.
- A better understanding of how they learn.
- Improved confidence in talking about their learning.

2. Raise Attainment in Writing

We are working to improve writing skills across the school and ELC by:

- Using PM Writing strategies consistently.
- Providing regular opportunities for creative writing.
- Moderation activities to ensure writing judgements are fair and consistent.
- Developing environments that inspire children to write.

What this means for children:

- More enjoyment and confidence in writing.
- Improved progress in spelling, structure, vocabulary and creativity.

3. Develop Our School and ELC Curriculum

We aim to refresh and strengthen our curriculum so it better supports children's needs. This includes:

- Joint planning between ELC and school staff.
- Planning learning through the 4 contexts of learning and the 4 capacities.
- A focus on developing creativity and essential meta-skills.

What this means for children:

- More relevant, exciting learning experiences.
- Opportunities to apply learning in real-life situations.
- Better understanding of the skills they are developing.

Additional Cluster Priority: Listening & Talking

Across our cluster, we are working together to improve Listening and Talking by:

- Creating shared assessments.
- Improving consistency in teaching and expectations.
- Supporting children to become confident communicators.

What this means for children:

- Stronger communication skills.
- Better participation in group discussions.
- Improved readiness for transition to secondary school.

Ethos Priority: "Our Children, Their Future"

We are embedding this refreshed strategy across our school community by:

- Sharing resources with pupils, families and staff.
- Highlighting the 5 key priority areas in school life.
- Including pupils and parents in conversations about learning.

Pupil Equity Funding (PEF)

PEF is used to support children most affected by poverty. This year it will help us to:

- Provide targeted support in writing, reading and numeracy.
- Support P7 pupils entitled to free school meals.
- Improve use of data to plan support.
- Enhance play-based learning in P1/2.
- Improve learning environments, including nurture spaces.

Our goal: Reduce attainment gaps and ensure every child can succeed.

What This Means for Our Children and Families

By the end of this session, children will benefit from:

- Higher quality learning experiences.
- Improved literacy outcomes.
- A more engaging and relevant curriculum.
- More opportunities to talk about their learning.
- Additional support where it is needed most.
